New Town High School Grading Policy 2022-2023



All assignments must be completed within the designated window to earn a grade greater than 50%. (See attached calendar)

Assignments that students do not attempt should be noted as LS (50%) in gradebook with a comment noting NO ATTEMPT.

Assignments that students attempt but do not demonstrate mastery should earn a grade of 60% with a comment of their actual grade.

Teachers must clearly communicate Redo policy for each assignment.

10-15 Minor Assignments

- Weighted 70% of gradebook
- Should apply or evaluate learning throughout the learning cycle including daily classwork, homework assigned after instruction, class discussions and activities, exit tickets, etc.

3-5 Major Assignments

- Weighted 30% of gradebook
- Should apply or evaluate learning at the conclusion of the learning cycle including projects, reports, unit tests, PBAs, etc.
- At least 1 major assignment should be an alternate evaluation of learning (not a test or quiz)
- For MYP classes, at least 1 major assignment should be assessed using the IB rubric

Graded Work- General Guidelines

• New Town High School uses a 50-point grading scale:

80% - 89% = B

90%- 100% = A

50% - 59%= E

60% - 69% = D

70% -79% = C

- An LS/ 50% indicates no student attempt to an assignment.
- Grades of 0-49% and M's (Missing) may NOT be entered as grades in the Schoology gradebook for minor or major assignments. The lowest score possible is an LS (50%).
- All graded assignments should be aligned to student mastery of course contents.
- All students should be given the opportunity to submit missing assignments within the grading window periods.
- All gradebooks should be updated at least every 2 weeks. Teachers will communicate grade updates with families. Families should check Schoology for grade updates and respond to teacher communication when prompted.
- Each course must include 10 15 minor assignments each marking period. Each course must include 3 – 5 major assignments per marking period.
- Educators should be mindful of the point value distribution and timeline of assignments.
 No single assignment should impact a student's overall grade by more than 5 percentage points.
- At the point a student earns a **second** LS during marking period, parent contact should be made and noted in FOCUS.
- When students are provided the opportunity to re-do each assignment to demonstrate deeper understanding, the highest score is then permanently entered in the gradebook.
